



The services we offer and that our participants can avail themselves of are: academic, college, career and financial aid advisement; assistance with applying to college and locating sources of financial aid and applying for financial aid; curriculum advisement; college campus visits; workshops covering a number of topics from "Financial Literacy", "College Readiness", "Sources of Financial Aid" and others; SAT preparation classes and fee waivers for the exams; tutoring; recognition awards and other educational services that will assure their success in completing high school and accessing college.
